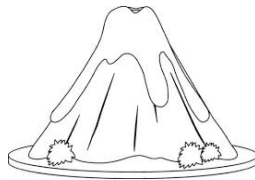

eōs		them (masculine, d.o./acc.)
eās		them (feminine, d.o./acc.)
eō	īre (irregular)	to go
epistula	epistulae feminine (abbreviated) f. -ae	letter
inquit		he/she/it says
meus	mea, meum (abbreviated) -a, -um	my
prīnceps	prīncipis masculine m.	emperor (not prince)

redeō	redīre (irregular)	to return
revocō	revocāre (1st) (abbreviated) -āre	to call back
salūtō	salūtāre (1st) (abbreviated) -āre	to greet
salvē		hello! (literally, “be well/healthy!”)
spectō	spectāre (1st) (abbreviated) -āre	to watch
trādō	trādere (3rd) (abbreviated) -ere	to hand over
urbs	urbis feminine f.	city
valē		goodbye! (literally, “be strong!”)
veniō	venīre (4th) (abbreviated) -īre	to come
ad Rōmam/ Rōmam		to/towards Rome (preposition + accusative)
ad urbem		to/towards the city (preposition + accusative)
